1937: at this time the old homestead contained five apts., and one bathroom.

It was purchased by Her & Jeanne Johnson. Herb began restoring the place, added a gurage at the back and the old brick was again painted, this time gray. The additions to the rear were covered with gray siding.

Herb died in 1995 and his wife continued to live in the old Hersney home. The upper floor was converted into a one person apartment.
