NELSON FORSYTH::: information from Richard Radcliffe; 1855.

On the S.E. cr. of Forsyth St. and the ri ver road, was the home of Nelson Forsyth, where the Sterling Bank now is. It was almost opposite the railway station, which stood just about where the ferry landing is at present.

Mr. Forsyth was a very active and energetic man, taking a very active interest in all public affairs. He was Reeve of the village on several occasions. His wife was a most charming lady, and an admirable hostess.
