 indenture of bargain and sale dated the third day of September
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty
 four between William Beck, common, and Sarah his wife
 of the one part and William Bruce Esq^r of the other part
 all of the Township of Burtis District of Niagara and
 Province of Canada Westmoreth: That the said William Bruce
 and Sarah his wife for and in consideration of the sum of
 one hundred pounds of lawful money of said Province, to
 them in hand paid by the said William Bruce as a sign the
 receipt or return of the purchase money, the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, ceded,
 transferred, conveyed, and confirmed, and by their power do
 grant bargain, sell, give transfer, convey and confirm unto
 the said William Bruce his heirs and assigns forever, all
 and singular tenements that certain parcel or tract of land and tenements
 - more particularly lying and being in the Township of Burtis
 in the District and Province aforesaid containing by a meas-
 -urement one acre, being composed of the North West part
 of Lot number eleven, in the Township of Burtis, in the County of
 Hamilton of Burtis, and Butter and bounded or measured
 otherwise known as follows: To wit is to Say beginning
 at the North West angle of said Lot number eleven in the
 Township of Burtis at the place where the line between the
