

## THE HART & COOLEY PLANT FORT ERIE. ::::

The Hart 7 Cooley Plant started in Fort Erie in 1909 in a small place across from the Review company, just west of the Gulley. It was then known as TUTTLE & BAILEY. In 1914 its quarters were moved to the present size on Wood St., just west of the C.N.R. tracks.On march 15th.,1933 hart \*Cooley bought out Tuttle & Bailey, and the Canadian Company of Hart & cooley was formed. At the time this plant contained25.200ft. which included office space. It was to serve the heating and air-)conditioning needs of the industry in Canada. I had about 100 employees. In 1951 the plant was managed by C.k. souder & B.M. Clark. In this same year O.C. Teal was awarded a contract of \$125.000 to add an additional 10.000 ft. of floor space. The contractor was Arthur B. Scott of Welland.


In 1936 Tuttle and Bailey was bought out by Hart & Cooley, and American firm from Michigan.
