"And be not conformed to this world but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind that ye may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God." Rom. 12: 2.

Apostle wants to impress upon the mind: of Cod's dear believing children- The also at lute necessity of a refusal to conform, 10 make, to yuck, or to fashion their bodies like the world does. The body is what the Apostle refers to when he says in the pereceding verse, "I beseech you, therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, hoI. acceptable unto (God, which is your reasonable service." He does so carnetlye entreat the believers in Christ (he calls them brethren), to present their bodice: upon the altar of God, a sacrifice that is alive, not sickly, almost ready to die, but holy, acceptable. He makes it very plain when he says, which is your reasonable service, in the German (Welches sci cues vernuenftiger Gottesdienst).

The nature of God is very reasonable, and His children must have the same natore. The spirit of God wants full possession of the heart and mind. It is not reasonable that sweet and bitter water will spring up out of one and the same well, neither is it reasonable that a Christian can serve Cod acceptably and be conformed to this world.
