In the passing away of Miss Jean Russel, on Thursday last, Fort Erie loses a well-know and highly respected citizen. While her health had not been perfect, she had been able to be out occassionally, until thursady morning when she was taken suddenly ill with a sinking spell, and passed away peacefully at 11.30.
