ALONZO CLARK MATHER .::: CHICAGO.

After leaving Quincy Mr. Mather settled in Chicago. It was not long before he came up with the idea for a new railway stock car so that the cattle could be transported long distances, without intermediate unloading. It was a spacious well ventelated car, with springs and feeding and watering facilities. It was called the Palce Stock Car, and at one tome there were 11,000 in use on the railroads. "ith the production of this stock car, and it's leasing Mather lay the foundation for his great fortune.

In the middle 20's he built "The Mather Tower building. In 1933 the Tower property was put in trust for an old ladies home to be built on his death. It was to be called " The Alonzo Mather Aged Ladie's Home. It was built on Sheridan Rd., north of Edgewater

Beach. .

While in Buffalo Mather built a large appartment house on the site of the approaches to the proposed Bridge. He called it the " ALLIANCE".

Mr. Mather leaves a fund of \$ 250,000 . for Peace Bridge Memorials in recognition of 100yrs. of Peace between the two countries; and also to be used for the maintenance of Mather Memorial Park.
