John Atwood came to Victoria in 1890, on Oct. 1st. He opened a Grocery store on the n.s. of Jarvis St. in a block owned by Mr. Wector. It had an ice house in the front and a slaughter house behind. On Feb. 1st., 1891 he bought the undertaking business. In 1892 John built a store and a dwelling on the north side of Dufferin St. He operated the funeral business from here also, and a large barn at the back was used to store the large glass walled hears. He operated his business on Dufferin St. for forty years. In the early 40's the buildings were burnt.

In 1895 he took over the furniture business, and in 1928 he built his store on the south side of Jarvis St. In 1931 he built a large brick home on the south side of Wintemute where he lived the remainder of his years. In the fall of 1940 Mr. Atwood constructed an up to date funeral parlor and undertaking business on Wintermute St. by his home.

Mr. Atwood was Reeve of Bridgeburg from 1909- 1913. He was a member of the Town council for 35 yrs. and was elected 21 consecutive times. In 1913 John Atwood was elected Warden of Welland Council . In 1917 he was elected Bridgeburg's second Mayor.

John M. Atwood an ex warden of the County of Welland, many times Reeve of the former town of Bridgeburg & Deputy Reeve of the amalgamated Town of Fort Erie on numerous occasions; who retired from active politics this year, due to ill health, one of the best known Liberals in the County of Welland, and a former President of the Welland County Liberal Association; died at home yesterday afternoon.

Mr. Atwood a native of the adjacent Willoughby Township, came to this section when it was still known as Victoria, and latterly International Bridge; where he established a furniture and undertaking business. which will still be carried on by his sons. He was continuously in municipal politics, and had held office more than any living citizen, up till the time of his death; many times being elected unanimously. He was dean of Welland City Council when he retired last year, in number of years and service.

Serviving are his widow, three sons Loyd, a member of the Board of Education, Ira F., John: & Edward, latter of the Canadian Custom's & Excise Staff: and two daughters Mrs. Reeve Mc. Phee, asle a Civil Servant here, and Miss Vera.

Mr Atwood was born April 4th. 1866 the year of the Fenian Raid. In addition to building the Atwood Block, one of the finest in the business section; he constructed four fine homes on the south side of Wintemute St., occupied by himself and various members of his family, and in addition owned considerable other property. He was an active member for years in the Foresters, having held various posts in that fraternity.
