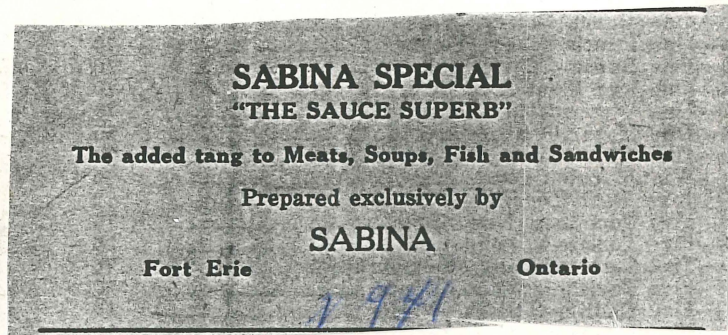


SABINO"SS Rest. # 37. West side of Bennet St. & Russel:opposite Horton Steel.

Built in early 30's by louie Sabino. Operated till the middle 40's.
on the north side of the rest. was a large gurage holding almost ten
car spaces. Several of the Horton staff rented from Mr. Sabino.
The rest. was eventually converted into an apartment building.

The firm started making heating registers in a small building on Jarvis St. It moved to a plot of ground off Wood St. in Amigari in 1914 where it built it's new plant at a cost of \$25000.00. Tuttle & Bailry was bought out in 1936 and the name changed to Hart and Cooley Manufacturing..

In 1983 the plant had it's first strike. In the spring of 84 the office was closed and moved to Oakville. In March 84 they announced that the Fort Erie plant would be closed for good and the operations moved to Oakville where it has been consolidated with Torin Manufacturing (Canada) Ltd.
