The couple operated a farm

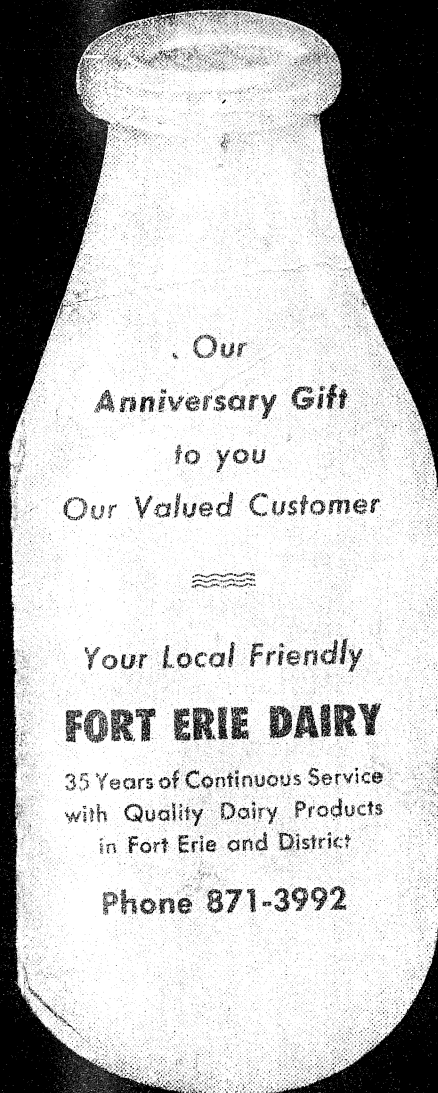
