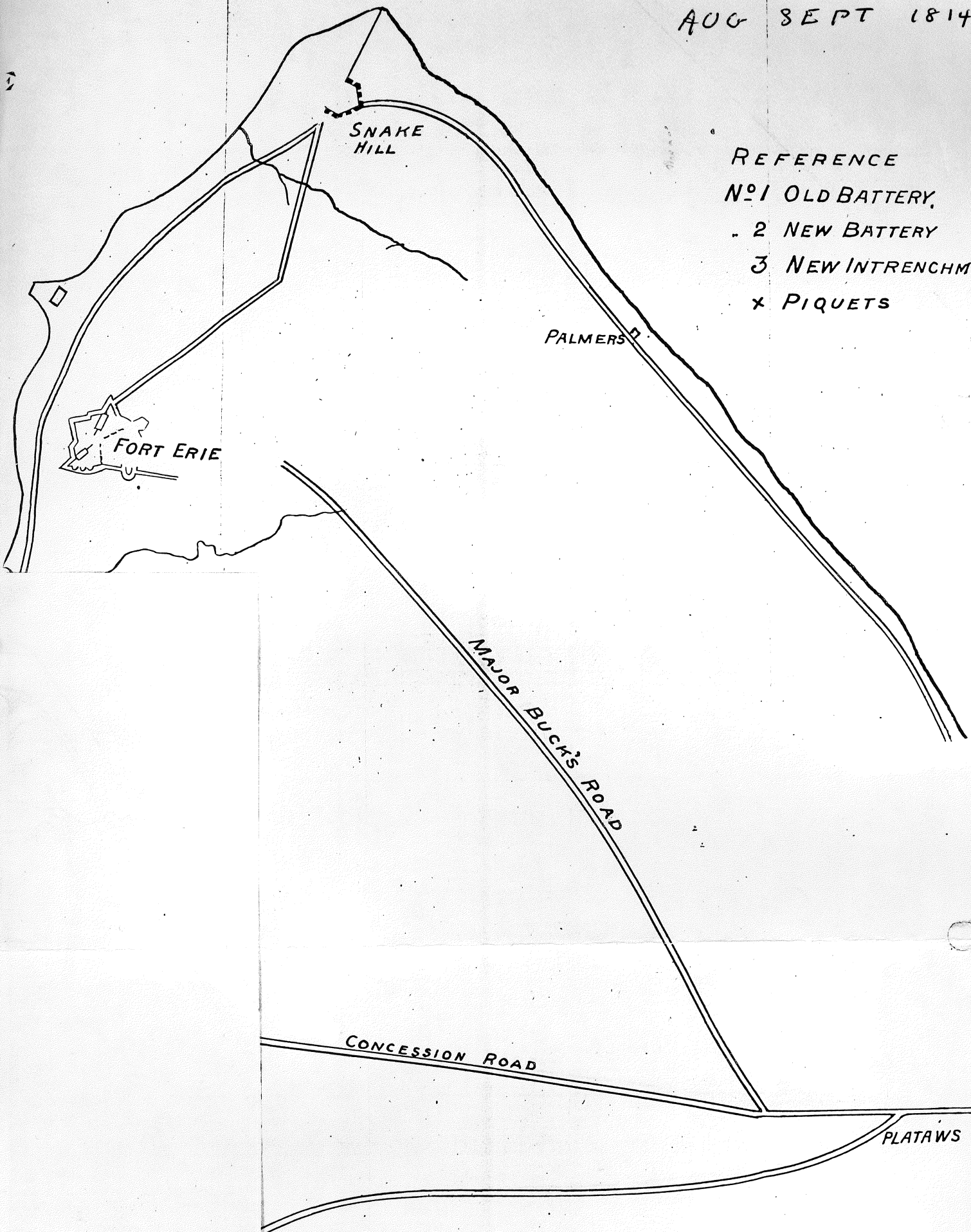
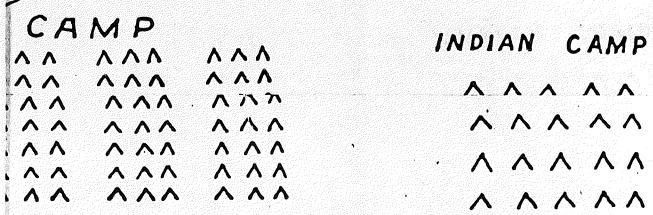

Lewis Palmer
July 18 - 1833

A Memorial to be registered pursuant to the statute
in such case made and provided of a Deed bearing date the
eighteenth day of July in the Year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and thirty three and made by and
between Jane Hardison of the township of Bertie
in the County of Lincoln, District of Niagara, and
Province of Upper Canada Widow of Benjamin Hardison, late
of the same place, deceased, Yeoman of the one part and Lewis
Palmer of the same place Yeoman of the other part
Whereby the said Jane Hardison for and in
consideration of the sum of twenty five pounds of
lawful money of the said Province to her in hand
paid by the said Lewis Palmer, the receipt whereof
is thereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold
aliened, transferred, conveyed and confirmed unto the
said Lewis Palmer his heirs and assigns for ever all
and singular that certain parcel or tract of land
and premises situate lying and being in the
township of Bertie aforesaid, and is described as
being Village lot number two, among a Tier of lots
laid out by the said Jane Hardison: and is more
particularly described as being a part of eleven acres
of the north part of lot number two in the first conception
of the township of Bertie aforesaid, on the Niagara
river

River, granted by the Crown to Henry Winedaker
the 6th day of May 1796. and afterwards to wit, on
the seven th day of August in the last Mentioned
year, granted bargained and sold by the said Henry
Winedaker to ~~the~~ David Cowan and afterwards
to wit on the tenth day of November 1801. granted
bargained and sold by the said David Cowan to
Benjamin Hardison and afterwards to wit
on the thirty first day of May One thousand,
eight hundred and twenty three devised by the
said Benjamin Hardison to his wife Jane Har-
-ison aforesaid: which said Village Lot is
better and bounded or may be otherwise known
as follows (that is to say) Commencing at
the south east angle of Richard Thompson's
Lot. Then south two and a half degrees west
one chain and twenty five links; Then west
two chains; then north two and a half degrees
east one chain and twenty five links. Then
east two chains to the place of beginning,
containing one fourth of an acre be the same
more or less. Together with all and singular
the hereditaments and appurtenances to the
said premises in any wise belonging.

To have and to hold the same with the
appurtenances free and discharged from all
