


this lot on the north west cr. of Niagara St. & Catherine. in 1858 is marked as belonging to J.W. Lewis.


North side of Gilmore Rd. 1855;;;

AFTER A FIRE IN THEIR HOME IN BRIDGEBURG THE THOMAS FAMILY MOVED TO THE NIAGARA BLVD, AND BUILT A LARGE TWO STORY HOME OVERLOOKING THE RIVER NO. 96. IT WAS BUILT IN 1890 and with it went a very large farm. In 1900 after the death of the senior members, the farm was split, with George frederick Montillon getting the home and 300 acres. The frontage was 180 ft. and the depth , 500 to 600 depending on the railway which ran behind the property.

George Thomas built on the north west cr. of Gilmore and the river rd., Addie and Georie built a small home on the hill, just before the tracks. Johnny moved to a place on Idlewylde just west of ST. Pauls Church, on north side.
