Township of Humberstone, County of Welland.

pound nets with a single head for each

The present License requires strict conformity with the various provisions of the
FISHERY LAWS now (or hereafter) in force, and to all regulations emanating from the
GOVERNOR GENERAL in COUNCIL and DIRECTIONS by FISHERY OFFICERS, in
default of such compliance, the same will become void and forfeited forthwith, saving more-
over the penalties imposed by law.
