

Aug. 12th Sarah Graham Born Ireland Dec. 3rd 1835. Died Aug. 10th 1914 at 142 Main St., City N.F. South. 78 years 8 months 7 days. Was buried in Lot 400 on th North Sidde of her late husband at 2:40. All men attended. Walked up. Just the herse. A fine afternoon. Grate exsitement over the war. Boys all going. Rev. Hockey officiated. Undertaker - Geo. Morse. Opening grave \$5.00 paid. White & Climenhage, Sextons. Ruff Box was to lite. Had to take it up.

Aug. 20th Fredrick Thomas Potter, age 2 years, 2 months, 6 days. Cause of death - Colitis & entervitis. Aug. 18th 1914. Born June 12, 912, N.F., Ont. Parents Religion - Methodist. Residence 498 Victoria Ave. Was buried in Lot 268 Old Part South East End of Cemetery. A nice funeral. Snowing all day. Too much rain. Cemetery looking fine. Grass green again. A grate lot of flowers given by friends. Was fetched in a flower waggon by John Robins. War on in Europe. Tearable. Our boys just going down to Lower Province 25000 Col. Sam. Huse Command. Rev. Hockey officiated. Undertaker - Geo. Morse. Asst. B. Heatherington. Opening grave \$2.00 paid. Samuel White, Sexton. Our falag on pole near wore out. Mr. & Mrs. Marshall Hear that go flag from Toronto.

Sept 12th Chester Ray Wilson, age 19 years 13 days. Farmer Stamford Township. Cause of Death - Spasm on Sept 7th 1914. Was a stronge young man. Was thrashing grain the day before his death and went to bed. In morning was found dead. He was buried in there Lot 70 on Hill. Was a son of newton Wilson. A large lot turned out. Beautifull flowers. Buried at 3:45. A fine afternoon. The Rev. Mr. Bonner, Baptist, officiated. His remarks at the grave was fine. Undertaker - Geo. Morse. Assistant - Blake Heatherington. Opening grave \$5.00 paid. A. Clemenhage & S. White Sextons. Cave in.

Sept 15th Edward Blair Forsythe, age 23 years 11 months & 30 days. Basket maker. Belonged to the Solgiers. Was out at the Montrose Yards and got on to one of the freight trains in theevening to get a ride and fell off and was cut rite into across the stomach. Just barely held together. Was a sad thing. His home was in Beamsville. had one brother who came to the funeral. He was born in Hamilton, Ont. Was killed on Sept 11th 1914. They had a millitary funeral service at Mr. Morses by English Church Minister and they marched up to the cemetery and they had service there. The Firing Partey fired 3 volleys from the north side of the grave. Then two buglars blew the taps. Was very nice. He was buried at the head of George Whalley Head Stone Oldd part. It was just 3:30 when blowing Taps. A beautifull afternoon. Grave yard look fine with new flag on pole. Fighting hard in north of Verdun. Driving the Germans back with
