His home stood on the corner of PRINCESS and ARCHANGEL. It was a four square brick house with its glass cupola and long shuttered windows and veranda long gone; and once vine covered.

Still standing in 1969 though remodeled to some extent.

STOCKDALE:::: Wallace John...

Mr. Stockdale's great-grandfather was Andrew Miller, who was brought to Niagara with Indian captives when 9 years. Andrew Miller's first son was John Burch Miller, and he settled in Port Colborne.

Wallace Stockdale was born in Bertie Township on May 16, 1866 and lived by the river on what now is known as the McAffee farm. His parents were John Stockdale, farmer; and Elizabeth Miller Stockdale. In 1929 he went into partnership with H.E. Ray; Real Estate & Insurance. Before going into partnership he sold the farm in 1926, but kept enough for his residence, moving to the village of Bridgeburg however, at a later date.

Back two blocks from Niagara street, on Princess street, at the corner of Archangel, still stands the four square brick house of William Stockdale, with its glass cupola and long shuttered windows and veranda long gone and once vine-covered before tragedy visit-
