FORT ERIE CORRESPONDENCE.

The young man Fred. Rainey, who met with such an untimely death recently, was taken to his last resting place, on Thursday last, and was one of the most imposing ceremonies that has taken place for many years. The remains were taken from the father's residence to the Temperance Hall, which was draped for the occasion, when a solemn and imposing discourse was delivered by the Rev. Mr. Mooney, Wesleyan minister. Two hymns were sang by the choir of the I. O. G. T., suitable for the occasion. The hall, which is large, would not hold the number present, many having to stand outside, showing the respect to the memory of the deceased. His remains, which were encased in a beautiful full-mounted coffin, on which were wreaths of flowers, his volunteer uniform and temperance regalia, was carried to the Church of England grave yard, by his late companions, with whom he was held in great esteem, after which the beautiful and impressive burial service was read by the Rev'd Mr. Arnold. The Volunteers, under command of their respected Captain, Newbigging, fired three volleys in the air, when all that was mortal of our departed young friend was laid in the grave. His aged parents and five brothers, who were present and stricken with grief, had the sympathy of all who were present on the melancholy occasion.
