DOUGLAS MEMORIAL HOSPITAL FORT ERIE, ONTARIO

ERECTED and endowed with funds generously given by William Douglas, M.D., born in Fort Erie on the 23rd day of December, 1846, who after practising his profession in Fort Erie for over Fifty years, died on the 30th day of August, 1929.

The Executors and Trustees of the Estate, who were responsible for the planning and construction of the Hospital and subsequently for its operation, decided at the outset that this memorial to Dr. Douglas should be distinctly Canadian in its

architecture and construction. They, therefore, selected Mr. William Lyon Somerville, A.R.C.A., of Toronto, to design and supervise the construction in keeping with the conception of Dr. Douglas. Actual erection was begun in August, 1930.
