She applied for land stating that she was the orphan daughter of Nicholas Huffman who was discharged from the Loyal Rangers, 24th., Dec. 1783, and some time after was entered on the plan of Fort Erie Township for 300 acres and received a ticket from the serveyor. The Coucil recommended that the lands due Nicholas Huffman should be granted to his heirs surviving. (8th., July 1796.)

## SGT. GEORGE HUFFMAN::

He rode with the Buttlers Rangers in the war of the

american Revolution under the British Flag. He was later surrendered by General John Buck in 1813 at the Old Fort to the invading American forces. He owned a number of fertile acres in Fort Erie.

Grandaughter Ada Regina Huffman: the dauther of John F. Huffman. She was born 1872 & died in 1942 at the age of 70. She married Harry H Berry, who servived her, along with a daughter Mr. Harold Ogelvie and two sons Thomas & Jack Berry.
