

MANSTRATTON HALL: JARVIS ST. 1918. First called Stratton and Mann's Hall.

Construction began on this large two story building at the foot of Jarvis in 1918. It was built as a garage for George Stratton & John H. Mann. In 1929 Mr. Mann was bought out by George Stratton who completely remodelled the building. The ground floor was tore out and three stores added. They were occupied by the Bank of Commerce, Gibson's Jewelry Store and Eatons Grocery. The second floor auditorium was used for a Lodge room and a place for dances. At the time of reconstruction a cellar was added to the building.
