

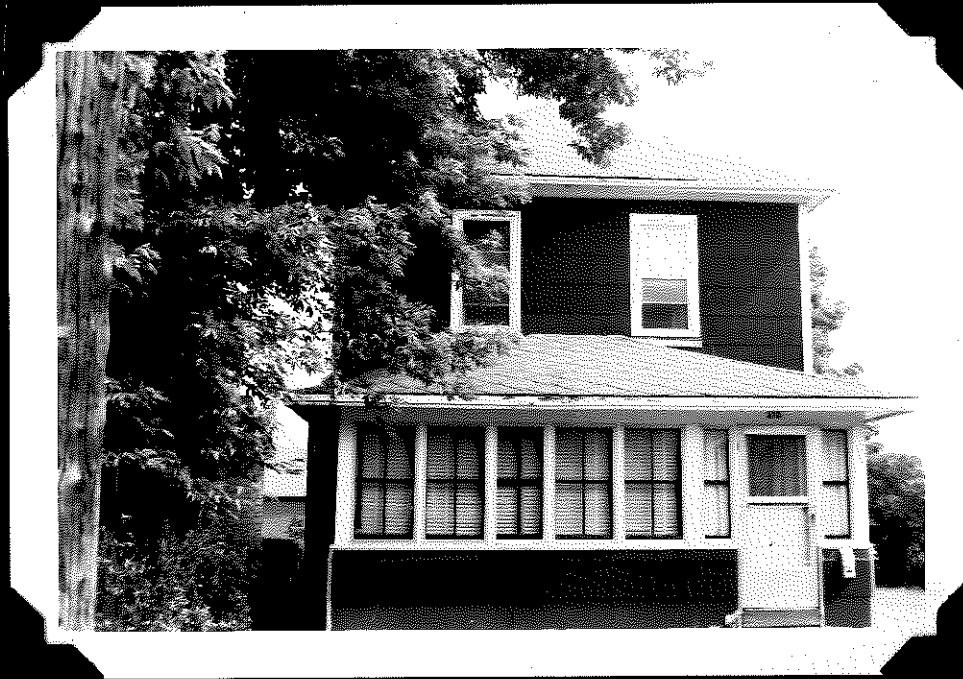
The home of Hyrman Fite::: Ne. cr.Phipps St.

Hiram Fite and his wife had the large general store on the south east corner of Jarvis and Central Ave. It was operated by Norman and Emma after the death of their parents. When they sold the old home they moved into the apartment above the store. In 1924 John Baker, who was a brother of Emma purchased the store, and ran it for a number of years. It was eventually moved from the property.

Mar. 23, 1917 Mrs. Almira Fite died. Born near Dunville, moved to Ridgeway, Point Abino: and Humberstone as well as Essex and in 1900 moved to Bridgeburg. Mr. Fite purchased the Barnie House at the time and operated it till 1908 when he sold to George Depew. Mr. & Mrs. Fite retired to the large brick house they had built on the north east cr. of Central and Phipps St.
