

UPPER-CANADA.

GEORGE the THIRD by the grace of GOD of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King, Defender of the Faith, and so forth.

To all to whom these Presents shall come, GREETING:

KNOW YE, that we of our special grace, certain knowledge, and meer motion by Philip Benjamin... DO GIVE and GRANT unto and his heirs and assigns forever, a certain parcel or tract of land... containing by admeasurement... from Lake Erie with the broken front... and Square, lying and being in the Township of... District of our Province aforesaid...

Handwritten notes on the left margin: 'The number of Acres to be sold were purchased of the Crown... by the late Philip Benjamin and transferred with the consent of the Board of the Home Office of the contract in complete... with their instructions... 27th 1790'

AND whereas by an act of the parliament of Great-Britain, passed in the thirty-first year of his Majesty's reign, entitled, 'An act to repeal certain parts of an act passed in the fourteenth year of the said Majesty's reign, and to make further provision for the government of the said province...' it is declared, that 'no grant of lands hereafter made shall be valid or effectual unless the same shall contain a specification of the lands to be allotted and appropriated solely to the maintenance of a parochial clergy within the said Province...'

Now we have caused an allotment, or appropriation of... to be made in a certain Township in the County of Lincoln... and to be held for the use and behoof of the said parochial clergy... and as nearly as the same can be observed... to the several parts of the same to be thereby granted as aforesaid.

WE HAVE AND TO HOLD the said parcel or tract of land to Philip Benjamin... his heirs and assigns for ever, having nevertheless to our heirs and successors, all tenures of goods and chattels, the said parcel and that shall or may hereafter be found on any part of the said parcel or tract of land hereby given and granted as aforesaid, and being and to be held by the said Philip Benjamin, his heirs and assigns, and the growing up, any part of the said parcel or tract of land hereby granted as aforesaid. Provided always that no part of the said parcel or tract of land hereby granted as aforesaid shall be used or employed in any of the following before the said Philip Benjamin, his heirs or assigns shall and do make three years of good and sufficient building or other works... (to be the said Philip Benjamin, his heirs or assigns, or any of them, or their own right lawfully purchased or otherwise) and be therein, or such fine person as he therein resident, he and they in the space of... since next calling the building to the same. Provided also that if at any time or times hereafter the land so hereby given and granted to the said Philip Benjamin, his heirs or assigns shall come into the possession and tenure of any person or persons whatsoever, either by virtue of any conveyance, inheritance or exchange, or by gift, voluntary, devise or mortgage, such person or persons shall cause every parcel next aforesaid to be recorded in the necessary office of the said province, in pursuance of all or any of the said conditions, limitations and restrictions, this said grant, and every thing herein contained, shall be, and we do hereby declare the same to be void and void, to all intents and purposes whatsoever, and the land hereby granted, and every part and parcel thereof, shall revert to, and become vested in us, our heirs and successors in the manner as if the same had never been granted. Any thing herein contained to the contrary in any will notwithstanding.
