AUDREY MILLER LAURIE U.E.

Widow of Russell M. Laurie, Manager of the Western Region Ontario Hydro, London, Ontario, at the time of his death in 1964. Daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Edgar Miller, both life time residents of Niagara Falls, Ontario and both descendants of early pioneers on the Niagara River Parkway and the Lake Erie shore in Bertie and Humberstone Townships. She attended Barker Street School, Stamford Collegiate in Niagara Falls, Ontario, and Broughton Business College in Niagara Falls, N.Y.

Well-known in social sports she was an early member of Niagara Falls Badminton Club; Lookout Point and St. David's Golf Club; Islington and St. George's Golf Club of Toronto; Highland Golf and Curling Club of London; and at present a member of the London Hunt and Country Club of London, Ontario.

Always interested in early Canadian and local history, she is a Charter and Life member of the Ontario Genealogical Society; member of Toronto Branch United Empire Loyalists' Association of Canada; Life Member of Canadian (Society of Friends) Historical Society; Founder of the Audrey Miller Laurie Canadiana Group of London, Ont., and originator and owner of the "Salt Box" on Lake Erie, considered to be one of the three oldest houses in Haldimand County; also former member of Engineer's Wives and other social and local societies in Niagara Falls, London, Grimsby and St. Catharines area.

Her only son, Stuart M. Laurie, predeceased her in 1967. She has three grandchildren; Christopher, Michael, Lynda Laurie and her daughter-in-law, Nellie (Mrs Stuart Laurie) of Mississauga, Ontario, and one sister Violet Miller Ryson of St. Catharines, Ontario.

Interment will be in the family burial plot in historic St. John's Anglican Burying Ground, Ridgemount, Fort Erie, Ontario, where sleep six generations of the Loyalist Andrew Miller of Miller's Creek, Niagara Parkway.
