Expect To Build 30 Homes Under Government Plan

FORT ERIE — The number of homes likely to be built in Fort Erie under the Dominion-Provincial partnership plan has been cut from 45, originally applied for, to probably 30, Mayor Charles H. Price comments. This decision will not be final, however until Tuesday planning officials again meet the council. However, it was indicated today that 30 new units will take care of the most pressing needs of Fort Erie's housing problem, which, as in many other industrial centres continues to be quite acute, despite new residential building

constantly underway. Mayor Price indicates that municipally-owned lots on Highland Avenue, which is entirely equipped with water and sewage facilities appear to be most acceptable to Department of planning officials. Applications for more than 45 dwellings have been received.

Plan Erection Of 40 Houses In Ft. Erie

FORT ERIE (Special)—Fort Erie Council, meeting in committee as a whole, decided to permit John E. Bastow, St. Catharines contractor, at his own expense to proceed with the digging of trenches and laying of sewers on Jessie Street and Highland Avenue, under his agreement with the municipality to erect houses in the area. M. J. Storm and Company of Fort Erie was engaged for such work, under the supervision of the town engineer. The town of Fort Erie will relieve Mr. Bastow of such liability when so deems advisable, and will reimburse him for the amount expended at that time. Mr. Bastow is hopeful of erecting 40 houses to relieve existing shortage here, is expected to proceed with a block of ten. Sewage and water are necessary for initial construction work. The project is located on the extension of Highland Avenue.

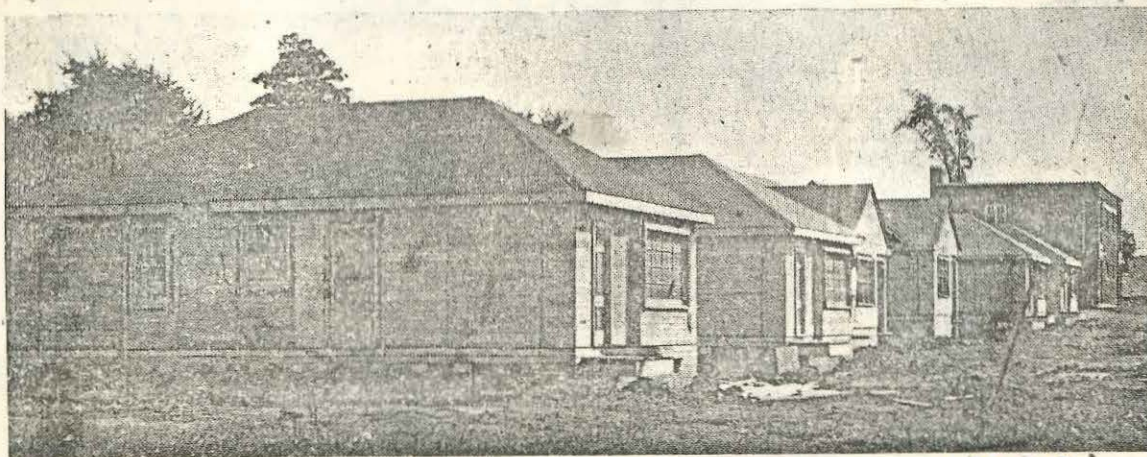
