1. Ist I give to my son Christian all my real estate in the township of Willoughby, containing by admeasurement 200 acres.
2. 2nd. I give to my daughter Catherine Lapp 87 $\frac{1}{2}$, 10 shillings & four pence currency.
3. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Sherks children, the sum of 90 $\frac{1}{2}$ 5 shillings and four pence.
4. I give to my daughter Esther Sherk the sum of 98 $\frac{1}{2}$, 10 shillings and four pence.
5. I give and bequeath to my daughter Sussannah Knisley the sum of 88 $\frac{1}{2}$, 19 shillings and a penny.
6. I give and bequeath to my daughter Margaret Dunn the sum of 73 $\frac{1}{2}$ 15 shillings and four pence.
7. I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Hershey the sum of 71 $\frac{1}{2}$ 7 shillings and 10 pence.
8. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Kennedy the sum of 124 $\frac{1}{2}$ 5 shillings and four pence.
9. I give and bequeath to my son John Hershey the sum of 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ 15 shillings and four pence.
10. I give and bequeath to my son Abraham the sum of 20 $\frac{1}{2}$, 15 shillings and four pence.
11. I give and bequeath to my son Christian the balance of the said 700 $\frac{1}{2}$, after he has paid other sums stated.
12. I bequeath that in the death of any of my children, the money allotted shall go to their children.
13. I will and order the remainder of my estate real, and personal shall be equally divided among all my children that have served me.
14. I appoint my brother Henry Hershey, and my son-in-law Joseph Sherk as my executors.

No. 2975. Probate of the Will of Christian Hershey:::

A Memorial to be registered pursuant to the statute in such case made and of the probate of the last will and testament of Christian Hershey of the Township of Bertie of the district of Niagara and the Province of Canada Yeoman: being dated the ninth day of Dec. in the year of Our Lord, one thousand and forty three: whereby he gave and bequeathed unto his son Christian Hershey all his real estate in the township of Willoughby: composed of lot # fifteen in the first and second concessions of the said Township of Willoughby, Containing by admeasurement two-hundred acres , the same more or less: provided he pay the sum of seven hundred pounds lawful money of the Province; to the several Legacies in manner and primas therein mentioned and specified: and he further willed and ordained that it was his desire, that in the event of the death of either of his children, before the said several legacies should be paid over to his executors, to be paid by them to the children of his deceased child: to be equally divided amongst them, and paid as they became of age. He further willed and ordered and it was his desire that the residue of his estate and effects real and personal: should by his executors be equally divided amongst all his children who might survive him and his wife: and he did therefore nominate and appoint, his beloved brother Henry Hershey of Bertie aforesaid, yeoman: executor of his last will and Testament; and his son in law Joseph Sherk of the same place executor of this last will and testament, which said will and last testament if witnessed by Edmund Riselay of the Township of Bertie in the Niagara District, esquire."
