THE following records were researched at the welland registry office.

Mr. Hill appears to have been mixed up on the date of this house. She has mistaken the land transactions , as transfers of the actual home. Nowhere is there any mention of the house in these papers.

I have never heard of the governmanet at such an early date, owning the building( especially a home) and renting it out.

I have also checked maps of the town from the 1850's and although many homes are marked on them , there is none on this piece of property.

Unfortynatley this record supplied by Mr. s Hill was given to the Bertie Historical Society and they, have excepted it as fact, without questioning .

My own guess is that it is more than likely from the late 70's or 80's.
