Benjamin hardison left this lot to his wife Jane. in 1833 she sold it to Lewis Palmer.North of the Hardison home was a store, then a two story frame home that almost sat on the sidewalk/.For a time the property was owned by Aleander Cruikshank. There is no record of any members of the family occuping the land. there is no picture of the home existing, however there is a detailed discription of it from a member of the Ineson family who lived there.

Around 1917 a Mr. Mattison came to Fort Erie to work at the shipyards. he lived here with his relatives the Ineson family. The old home was demolished around 1927. (inf. Alex AlexANDER.)
