This piece of property was in the begining part of the original Mill site lands. Lot #3 on which this house stands was in the early 1800's owned by Thomas Burns.

1817: The Crown gave 20 acres of this property to Wm.Dunbar who operated the Mill at Waterloo Ferry. The lot ran approximately 821?2 ft. along the front of Erie and it ran back south eastery to the Mill Race: 132ft.This lot was only half in depth what it later contained.

1853: Oct. 28. Heirs of Thomas Burns to Orange Schryer::

" Joseph Tutton & wife: Wm. Norris & wife:

Edward Mc. Manners & wife".

1900: In the early 1900's the house went to the Campbell family.

etc. etc. The property was later purchased by R,F Furgason who owned most of the property on Erie St.

1940's: When the Niagara Parkway was completed, the home was purchased by Mr. Alexander, and moved to the west side of Archange St. between the alley and Forsyth St. North of the Wilbert home. It stands to-day almost as it did many years ago, except that it was put on a low foundation, while at the mill race sight it stood directly on the ground.
