

ORIGINATIONS OF ST. NAMES IN FORT ERIE

- Glenny Ave. ----- Charles N. Glenny , chairman of the School Board
- Bowden St.----- after Henry Bowden Warren; father of missAmelia Warren and former owner of the land.
- Henriette St.----- after Henrietta Daly Aunt of Mrs. Shaw and Mrs. Mannering.
- Erie St.----- The Westerly boundary line for Bridgeburg and Fort Erie. Changed to Concessionbecause of duplication.
- Erie St.----- A short St. in the South End, running south west on an angle from Niagara St. and being south of Walnut St.
- Russel St. ----- After William Russel.
- Jennett St.----- After the wife of William Russel.
- Highland Ave.---- Name given at the time Messrs. Rano& Newbigging filed the plan covering part of the Forsyth farm.
- Emerick Ave.----- After Henry Emerick former Postmaster and first Village Clerk of Bridgeburg; who owned and sub.-divided the land.
- Phipps St.----- after W.C. Phipps , the first Clerk of the Dept. of Forestryfor the Province of Ont.
- Jessie St.----- afterJessie Riselay , later Mrs. Jessie Bond.
- Dufferin St.----- after Lord Dufferin
- Courtwright St.---- probably after a member of the Cartwright family.
- Klauck St. ----- after John W. Klauck of Buffalo who gave the land to widen the lane into a St.
- Robinson St.----- after Judy Robinson; of the High Court Of Ont.
- Crooks St.----- after Adam Crooks ; the first Minister of Education of Ont. He succeeded Egerton Ryerson who had been instumental in forming the school system of the Province.
- Pattison St. ----- running from Emerick to Bowen Rd. ; now part of Central, named after Clayton Pattison who owned the land on which ST.Mary's Hall was built. He was the father of FT. Pattison , Collector of Customs.

- Bowen Rd.----- This rd. was once called Ferry St. It was renamed after William Robert and Henry Bowen, brothers who owned farms on either side of the rd. west of the town.
- Emerick Ave.---- Named after Henry Emerick, first village Clerk, and former Postmaster; who owned the land and filed the plan.
- Brock St.----- Named after Brock Forsyth a former owner of the land, and a brother of Mrs. Patrick Everett.
- Phipps St.---- Named after W.R. Phipps, the first clerk of the Ont. forestry Dept.
- Niagara St.-- A modified form of the Niagara River Rd., and since it's improvement the Niagara Blvd.
- Jarvis St.----- After Stephen Maule Jarvis of Toronto; a former owner of the land. He sub. the land in Victoria, and put the lots on the market.
- Lewis St.----- Named after the late George Lewis, in former times postmaster and express agent; and father of Henry Lewis, Village coal merchant.
- Wintemute St.-- named after the late John Wintemute, a former owner of the farm, the grandfather of Miss Amelia Warren town auditor for several years, also grandfather of the late George Lewis.
- College Ave.---- Named when George Lewis and the school board were looking for a new school site in the south ward.
- Catherine St.-- A short St. leading to the race track; after Catherine Lewis; mother of George Lewis and grandmother of Henry Lewis. Lewis Tavern was on this corner.
- Smith St.----- A very short St. running west from Concession, by the home of William Smith, who owned the land.
- Henrietta St.-- After Henrietta Dally.
- John St.---- After a brother of Miss Russel.
- Dunlop & Wood-- These two streets probably named after friends or relatives of Sophia Thornhill who laid out the plan.
- Gilmore Rd.---- The former boundary line between Bridgeburg and Fort Erie, named after a farmer by the name of Gilmore that owned a strip, very narrow in width, on the south side of the road from the river to beyond the Race Track.
