

HENRY EDWARD MILLER::: SON OF ANDREW JR. & ELLENORE PALMER:

As wife Mary Haun Miller had died in Jan. 1900; Henry Edward Miller devised to his nephews ::: William Franklin: Benjamin Edward: Harding Edward: & Edgar Miller: my farm composed of the North part of lot. no. 14 in the 5th., con. from the Niagara River in the Township of Bertie, and lot no. 14, in the 6th., con. N.R. in the said township: containing one hundred and fourteen acres more or less, to be devided equally among them share and share alike.

Harding lived here with his wife and daughter. After their death he continued to live in the old homestead. On Jan. 4th. when a widow he was paying the mortgage.

On May 8th. 1957, Harding E Miller & Bernice H. Benner married woman, sold to the Niagara Parks Commission,. The home was empty for a time, and shortly after it was destroyed by fire. Bert Miller and Audrie Laurie Miller visited this home after Hardings death and mentioned that it was full of Miller historical records; all of which were destroyed in the fire.
