

Dr. Charles Streets. 1923.

Born in Fort Erie, Dr. Charles Streets was persuaded by Dr. William Douglas to return to Fort Erie. He completed his education at the Toronto Medical School and took up his practise in the town Aug. 1st. 1923.

He was appointed divisional surgeon for the Wabash and Canadian National Railways. He was long associated with the Douglas Memorial Hospital, and took part in its building and equipping and served on the board for many years, where he served chief of staff for ten years. He served in the armed forces where he was Senior Medical Officer of the Canadian Army and in charge of all medical staff 1944- 1946. He returned to Fort Erie after the war and was made coroner. He died in Fort Erie 1968, Dec. 10th.
