ed unit overseas enlisted at the C.M.R. depot which was established in Hamilton in Jan. 1916, under Col. W.C. Brooks They were then taken overseas in one of the Canadian Expeditionary Forces.

Major Sharpe of Welland recruited an Infantry Battalion the 127th., C E.F. in Jan 1916, and several of the Dragoons joined this unit.

After the war the 2nd. Dragoons were reorganized into three units with Headquarters at St. Catharines, under the Command of Col. D. Sharpe of W Welland. The three squadrons were located at St. Catharines, Hamilton, and Welland respectively. The regiment has dismounted training in their local armouries in the spring and the fall, and mounted training for two weeks at Niagara Camp in June of the year.

At the present time (1930) the officers are: Col. W.C. Brooks, V.D. O.C., Major D.C. Wills, commanding "A" squadron, Major C. Chambers "B" s squadron, and Major Sutherland, "C" squadron. The strength of the Regiment is 25 officers and 180 other ranks. Col. R.Y. Eaton is honorary Colonel.
